HRCM 270	Building Human Capital (3 CR)
HRCM 280	Cultural Diversity & Marketing (3 CR)
HRCM 188	*Special Topics/Casino Accounting (1 CR)
HRCM 197A	*Special Topics/Casino Management Practicum (1 CR)
HRCM 197B	*Special Topics/Tribal and Gaming Law

*the special topic courses are aligned with BUAD 202, 212 and HRCM 111 and include 1 credit hour per course. Each of the 1 credit hour courses focuses on the casino relationship.

These credits are all transferrable to the AA/AS degree program. **A minimum of 90 credits are required of an AA/AS degree.** Prospective students should contact an advisor to discuss a degree plan that meets their educational and career goals.
