SCOPE OF WORK

This position will teach and facilitate workshops, classes and community culture events in the plateau culture area, primarily at the NWIC Nez Perce extended site.

DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES

- Teach cultural arts courses at the Nez Perce extended site, and within the plateau culture area as scheduled.
- Mentor new potential instructors and students, including cultural protocols, traditional teaching practices and skills.
- Coordinate, deliver and teach community education offerings, including monthly Family Culture nights and workshops.
- Coordinate Weavers Teaching Weavers workshops at Nez Perce extended site.
- Update and expand the artist directory on a semi-annual basis.
- Revise and update the current booklet for teachers.
- Work with Coast Salish Institute staff on formative and summative evaluation activities related to the grant.
- Assist the Dean of Indigenous Education and Nez Perce extended site manager with the Emerging Artist workshops.
- Prepare and maintain an annual work plan and produce regular reports.
- Participate in NWIC Nez Perce extended site meetings, and other NWIC meetings as requested.

SUPERVISORY RESPONSIBILITIES

This job has no supervisory responsibilities.

QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED

Bachelor of Arts degree in a related field; Master's degree preferred. Previous teaching experience in cultural arts, such as beading, moccasin making, corn husk weaving, regalia making, etc., as well as previous teaching experience in higher education and continuing education. Previous experience working in a tribal setting is preferred. Extensive knowledge of the plateau culture area and the people who live in the plateau culture area is preferred. Ability to demonstrate a variety of instructional delivery methodologies relevant to native communities; organizational skills necessary to coordinate workshops, classes, and community events; excellent verbal and written communication skills, as well as interpersonal/people skills. Proficiency in basic computer and software application skills.

Other Qualifications:

- Possess a valid driver's license.
- Must be able to travel within the plateau culture area when scheduled to teach or coordinate cultural arts workshops, etc.
- May be required to attend NWIC all staff meetings or training at the NWIC Main Campus.
