Continuing Education Unit (CEU) Program

WHAT IS A CEU?



A CEU is a measurement of time used towards learning to assist the professional to maintain his or her license/certification/designation in their profession. The primary purpose is to provide a permanent record of the educational accomplishments of an individual who has completed one or more significant non-credit educational experiences. One continuing education unit is equal to 10 contact hours of participation.



WHO CAN FILL OUT A CEU FORM?

High School & college students ages 16 and older, Teachers, Counselors, Nurses, and a person who is attending an event and needing to permanently track their attendance for professional development.

IS THERE A FEE? No there is no cost to process or fill out a CEU for tribally enrolled participants. CEU certificates are also no cost to the participant and are issued electronically via email attachment.

The benefits:

- Improve or build your skills through attending conferences, training or workshops
- Access to free or low cost workshops/events
- Access to official CEU by an accredited college
- Articulate to your clients / boss that you are dedicated to stay current in your market sector
- CEU is a Permanent tracking of your participation at an event or conference



WHAT INFORMATION IS REQUIRED?

A tribal I.D or a certification of Indian degree. Completing a CEU form and signing in on the events sign in sheet for each session attended. Fill out a survey provided by the event facilitators and/or with the CEU Coordinator.



WHY FILL OUT A CEU FORM?

CEU tracks hours of learning for professionals who require relicensing to maintain licenses, certifications, or designation in their profession. CEUs bring in funding that support free or low cost community and student activities such as cultural arts, cooking classes, summer youth camps, traditional foods and medicine workshops.



HOW MAY A PERSON OBTAIN A CEU TRANSCRIPT TO TRACK HOURS OF LEARNING?

A CEU Transcript may be requested by the participant by calling NWIC Student Services Program (360) 676-2772
