- ⇒ **Submit a copy of your High School or GED Unofficial Transcripts (or Diploma) (REQUIRED)**
- ⇒ **Complete the Northwest Indian College Application for Admissions**
- ⇒ **Submit Verification of Tribal Affiliation** (copy of front and back of enrollment card, CDIB, or letter from Tribe/Village verifying enrollment or status). This is very important in determining tuition rate.
- ⇒ **Submit Official Transcripts from all colleges attended (if applicable)**. If you would like credits evaluated toward your program of study at NWIC, please submit a **Transfer Evaluation Request Form**
- ⇒ **Complete Federal Financial Aid Form (FAFSA for current year)**. Complete online at www.fafsa.ed.gov
- ⇒ **Submit Financial Aid Data Sheet to the NWIC Financial Aid office**
- ⇒ **Submit Resident Life Center (Housing) Application** (Lummi Campus Student Only)

Assessment and Advising

- ⇒ **Make an appointment for a placement test. After test, bring scores to an advisor to register for classes**
- ⇒ **Make an appointment with advisor for Site Coordinator to discuss program needs and class schedule**
- ⇒ **Check with Financial Aid office regarding status of financial aid application**. Students must be accepted to NWIC to receive Financial Aid. Check with the office of admissions if you have not received a Acceptance Letter.
