SCOPE OF WORK

The Community Advocates and Responsive Education in Human Services (CARE) Program invites applicants for a part-time, adjunct, faculty position. The primary responsibilities of this position are to work with the department chair, tribal communities, and substance use programs to create professionally and culturally relevant curriculum that can be taught in multiple modalities. This position includes teaching, assessment, program planning and reporting.

DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES

The main components of this position include teaching, program development, and assessment.

1. Teaching: Faculty member will be expected to teach 50 minutes of content per credit hour and offer one hour of office hours per week for each course contracted. Preparation and grading may be above the contracted hours without additional compensation.
2. Curriculum Development: Design and re-design place based, culturally and professionally informed curriculum in Substance Use Disorders (SUD), working with community members and professionals to identify key focus areas.
3. Assessment: Develop and maintain quarterly course matrices that measure students' success toward course outcomes in alignment with the curriculum map and that demonstrate progress toward degree and institutional outcomes.

SUPERVISOR RESPONSIBILITIES

There are no supervisory responsibilities assigned to this position

Minimum Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree from an accredited college in human services, chemical dependency, or related field.
- SUD certification or willingness to obtain within 90 days.
- Demonstrated knowledge of the Revised Codes of Washington (RCW) and the Washington Administrative Codes (WAC) as they apply to substance use disorders.
- Experience working with diverse student populations (developmental, multicultural).
- Knowledge of Indigenous research theories and methodologies.
- Ability to effectively communicate in diverse situations.
- Strong interpersonal skills and ability to work in individual and group settings.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Master's Degree in related field.
- Experience teaching in a tribal setting.
- Experience teaching in a substance use disorder program.

Other Skills and Abilities:

- Understanding of assessment, particularly as it relates to the Teaching and Learning philosophy of NWIC
- Experience with or willingness to learn different modes of instruction (on-ground, online, ITV, hybrid, etc.), teaching and learning, and assessment
- Must be culturally knowledgeable and comfortable working in a tribal setting
- To perform this job successfully, an individual should have knowledge of basic word processing, spreadsheet software; internet and email in addition to proven competency with networks and teleconferencing.
